Show Information

Welcome to the IDTC Agility Show – Furry and Fun!

The emphasis is on FUN and HAVING A GO!

The Show will open at 8.30am with briefing at 8.50am. The first run will be at 9.00am.

Plenty of parking is available in the Friquet Garden Centre car park.

Food/refreshments/toilet facilities are available at Le Friquet Garden Centre.

We ask everyone involved to lend a hand to help with course re-builds between classes, putting poles up and down for different size classes and collecting leads and toys from competitors so that no-one needs to do a lot. Jobsheets will be available at the start of the day. Many hands really do make light work!

Dogs must be kept on a lead except when in the ring taking part in the Show.

Due to the close proximity of neighbours to the Friquet Field and the risk of losing the venue, dogs that constantly bark (whether within or outside a vehicle) cannot be allowed at the venue. If your dog(s) cannot be quietened the IDTC reserves the right to ask you to remove them from the venue.

****DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS****

Dogs are vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and also on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

Please note that this is an independent show. Winning rounds will not count towards progression levels at any Guernsey Kennel Club, Jersey Kennel Club, UK Kennel Club or FCI Licensed shows.

Prizes:

Rosettes will be awarded for 1st to 3rd place in all Classes with clear round rosettes outside these placings. Judge's special prizes may also be awarded.

Class Definitions:

Small Dogs: For dogs measuring 350mm or under at the withers. Height of jumps - 300mm.

Medium Dogs: For dogs measuring over 350mm and under 430mm the withers. Height of jumps - 400mm.

Intermediate Dogs: For dogs measuring over 430mm and under 500 at the withers. Height of jumps 500mm.

Large Dogs: For dogs measuring over 500mm at the withers. Height of jumps 600mm.

Any Size: Open to dogs that are not entered in any of the regular height classes on the day. This class is aimed at veterans, dogs that are unable to jump full height etc. There will be no weaves. Any dogs that enter this class at this show will still be eligible to enter other size classes at future shows. Maximum height of jumps: Large and intermediate dogs - 400mm and small/medium dogs - 200mm.

Course Definitions:

Classes that are not marked as "Have-a-go" will all be run under standard rules and are intended for dogs and handlers who are experienced at or ready to run complete rounds.



Jumping

(Classes 1-5): involves only normal jumps, tunnels and weaves.

Steeplechase

(Classes 7-11): Involves only normal jumps and tunnels. Fast and flowing course.

Pairs (Classes 13-17): Involves 2 handlers, and 2 dogs. Involves only normal jumps and tunnels. The first dog and handler will complete the course to finish in a specified area and will secure their dog (lead or hold by the collar) before passing a baton or touching the second handler waiting in the same (or adjacent) area who will then take their dog around the course. Time faults will be given for incorrect course, refusals etc. Dogs will be eliminated for not completing the course or fouling in the ring and may be eliminated if they are considered to be out of control.

Have-a-go Classes:

(Classes 6, 12 and 18): These Classes are intended to encourage less experienced handlers to try their hand in the ring with short sequences. Jumping, Steeplechase and Pairs classes will be as above, but courses will be split into several, 3-6 obstacle sequences. Help will be available (should you require it) to hold your dog in a wait on the start line and you may encourage your dog around the sequences with a toy, and restart at each different section. No food will be allowed in the ring. Times will be added together for the various sequences to arrive at a time for the whole course.

Standard Marking applies:

1. Refusal/Runout – 5 faults for each refusal/runout. If your dog refuses an obstacle/jump, it has to be completed before continuing rest of course.
2. Three refusals/runouts – elimination (with the exception of Pairs Have-a-go see class description)
3. Weave poles – the dog to enter the weave poles with the first pole adjacent to its left side. Each incorrect entry to be classed as a refusal – further error, maximum 5 faults – failure to complete correctly before negotiating any further obstacle, elimination.
4. All other obstacles – 5 faults for failure to negotiate correctly.
5. Handler deliberately touching any piece of equipment or their dog – 5 faults.
6. Out of control – elimination.
7. Taking the wrong course – elimination (with the exception of Pairs – see course description).
8. Fouling in the ring – elimination.
9. Course time – at the judge's discretion.
10. Dog wearing incorrect style of collar – elimination. Flat collars only, D ring allowed but no tags.
11. Any double handling or deliberate assistance given to a competitor whilst competing from either inside or outside the ring will result in elimination.
12. Except for mobility aids, (and all Have-a-go Classes when toys may be used) nothing shall be carried in the hand whilst the dog is under test and food shall not be given to the dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test – elimination.

Cumulative Marking/Time Faults – Time Faults will be added to faults from obstacles. Time faults are given when the dog fails to complete the course in the course time which the judge has set. A single fault or part thereof will be added for each second over the set time. Actual time will be recorded and rounding up or down will not be permitted.



Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any results and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.

Rules and Regulations

1. Entry fees are £5.00 per class.
2. The IDTC reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
3. Dog under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the competition are not eligible to compete.
4. Not for Competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. No dogs other than those officially entered shall be brought into vicinity of the IDTC venue. Dogs which have not been entered into any classes may be brought to the venue if entered as Not For Competition (NFC) on the entry form and the appropriate fee paid, if any. Dogs entered as NFC are not eligible to take part in any classes during the show.
5. Training in the ring - at the Judge's discretion, handlers will be permitted to bring a toy into the ring. If a toy is used or carried in the hand at any point during a class (with the exception of the Have-a-go classes) the run will be deemed to be a training round and will not count in the results. The course time applies after which the dog is to leave the ring. Only the handler and dog should be in the ring during a training round.
6. No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the competition.
7. Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half-slip collar or lead when under test. A flat close-fitting leather or webbing collar with a single D-ring is permitted provided the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar i.e. not attached by a ring.
8. Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge the IDTC reserves the right to appoint another judge.
9. No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
10. Kennel Club standard marking Regulations shall apply.
11. Height of hurdles will be standard, except as detailed in the class definitions section of the schedule.
12. Judges at an Agility Show may not handle a dog at the Show in any class they are judging.
13. Withdrawal of dogs from competition: A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the show if it is:
 - a. A bitch which is in season.
 - b. Suffering from any infectious or contagious diseases.
 - c. Interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent.
 - d. Of such temperament or is so much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or other animal.
 - e. Likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing.
14. Should circumstances so dictate the IDTC, in consultation with the judge, may alter arrangements as necessary.
15. In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, the IDTC will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on receipt of a stamped, addressed envelope submitted within one month of the show date.
16. Except for mobility aids, nothing shall be carried in the hand whilst the dog is under test (with the exception of the Have-a-go Classes when a toy may be used) and food shall not be given to the dog whilst in the ring. Competitors are prohibited from wearing bags or leads whilst under test.



17. Separate entry forms must be completed by each competitor and must be signed by the competitor or his authorised agent in accordance with provisions specified thereon. Entry forms must be accompanied by the appropriate fees.
18. Dog suffering from contagious or Infectious disease: No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period of 21 days prior to the competition may compete or be brought into the vicinity of the Show unless they are no longer showing symptoms and have provided written confirmation from a Vet that they are no longer contagious.
19. Animals at the Show: No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the Show during its continuance, except registered assistance dogs and their disabled handler, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the IDTC. However at the discretion of the IDTC, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the vicinity of the Show, provided those in charge of the dog confirm that the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
20. Welfare of Dogs: A competitor whose dog is entered in the Show should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise.
